

Online eReader – Open

 The online Cisco eReader will pop open in a new window. Make sure to allow Pop Ups from your browser.



Online eReader – Facts

- Each CCOID user may launch up to 5 simultaneous Online eReader sessions across multiple machines/browsers.
- Attempts to open more Online eReader sessions will result in a notice to close some of the active sessions.
- Any idle session will time out in 8 hours. You can keep a session active by navigating around, annotating, searching, or saving settings. Scrolling up or down will not reset the timeout timer.

Online eReader – Navigation

• <u>Navigation Scroll Bar and Go to page</u>: The navigation scroll bar and Go to page textbox appear on the bottom of the application. Use these to quickly navigate to specific pages.

Page 5 / 9 Go to page

- <u>Back to page</u>: To go back to the last page viewed, click **Back to page <last_page_number>** near the top right of the Annotations Pane.
- <u>Content Scroll Bar</u>: The scroll bar appears to the right of the content area when the text on a page is longer than the viewing space of the reader.

Online eReader – Navigation

<u>Next page / Previous Page</u>: To go to the next page, click the right arrowhead on the right side of the page. To go to the previous page, click the left arrowhead on the right side of the page.



<u>Magnify Image</u>:
 To enlarge an image or videos within the Online eReader, click the magnifying glass icon on the bottom right corner. Click the
 On the upper right hand corner to close.

Online eReader – Left Toolbar

Online eReader – Left Toolbar

- Exit eReader: Always use this button to properly close the user session with the CLNSpace server. Do not use the browser's Close button (the X at the top right of the browser) to close the reader as this will leave the session active until the session has timed out (currently set to 5 hours).
- <u>Full Screen</u>: This toggle feature is used to engage the full screen viewing mode.
- <u>Bookmark</u>: I This toggle button can be clicked to add/remove bookmarks based on the currently viewed page. A list of bookmarks will appear in the Bookmarks tab in the Annotations Pane.


Online eReader – Left Toolbar

 Print: This allows you to print up to 10 individual logical pages. A logical page is whatever is shown in the Content Pane. Depending on the length of the logical page being printed, that logical page may print out to a few physical pages on paper.

Note: Clicking the Print icon counts as a page printed, whether you actually print the page or not, so use care when clicking the Print icon.


- <u>Feedback</u>: This allows you to provide feedback.
- <u>FAQ</u>: This displays the Frequently Asked Questions.

Available Functions and Options



- <u>Notes</u>: Use this tab to compose notes on a given page or topic. All user notes are exportable and printable (by clicking Export or Print Notes, respectively, at the top of the Notes tab once a note has been added).
- <u>Bookmarks</u>: Click to view, edit and manage previously entered bookmarks.
- <u>Highlights</u>: Select this tab to view, add/edit comments to and manage previously highlighted material. User comments can be copied from the edit box.


- <u>Contents</u>: Click this tab to view the Table of Contents. The Table of Contents can also be used to navigate through the dbook.
- <u>Search</u>: Click the magnifying glass to search for text material, highlighted passages, bookmarks and your notes. You can click the Course radio button to search for text in the course material. Or you can click the Notes/Highlights/Bookmarks to search the annotations that you've made in the form of Page Notes, Highlight Comments, and Bookmark Titles.
- <u>Settings</u>: Click the gear icon to customize the highlight color, text size and font style. Remember to click **Save** Settings settings to keep your changes.



- <u>Highlight</u>: To highlight text in the Content Pane, select the text to be highlighted, right-click to bring up the right-click menu, then select **Highlight**.
- <u>Removing a Highlight</u>: To remove a highlight, right-click on the highlighted text in the Content Pane, then select **Remove**.
- <u>Reload</u>: To synchronize annotations (bookmarks, highlights, notes) with the server at any time, select **Reload**.

Highlights

 Adding a Highlight Comment: To add a comment to highlighted text, click the Highlights tab in the Annotations Pane, find the highlighted text that you want to add comments to, then click the text box beneath it.



 <u>Synchronize Annotations</u>: To synchronize your annotations with the server, right-click anywhere in the Content Pane to bring up the right-click menu, then select **Reload**.

iPad eReader – Facts

iPad eReader – Facts

- <u>Logout</u>: Currently there is no logout capability. Your user session will remain active even after exiting the eReader.






iPad Reader – dBook Download

- Download the redeemed dbooks that you want to be available offline by tapping the download icon in the dbook image (leftmost image).
- The status bar will display the download progress. You can pause or stop the download, if needed (middle image).
- Tap the dbook when it is ready to read (rightmost image).



iPad eReader - Opening a dBook

- Tap on a downloaded dbook to open it.
- Tap the Content pane to display the top & bottom toolbars.





iPad eReader – Navigation

 Navigation Scroll Bar: The navigation scroll bar appears at the bottom when you tap anywhere in the Content Pane, except at the left or right edge or on a link. Use the scroll bar to quickly navigate to specific pages.



- <u>Previous Page</u>: To go to the previous page, tap anywhere along the left edge, or swipe from left to right.
- <u>Next Page</u>: To go to the next page, tap anywhere along the right edge, or swipe from right to left.

iPad eReader – Top Toolbar

<u>Top Toolbar</u>: Tap anywhere in the content pane (except at the left or right edge or on a link) to display the top toolbar.



Functions and Options Available

- <u>Library</u>: <u>Clibrary</u> Tap to display your Library.
- <u>Annotations Toolbar</u>: Tap to change the top toolbar to the Table of Contents and Annotations toolbar.
- <u>Sync</u>: Tap to synchronize your annotations with the server. Otherwise your annotations are only saved on your local device.




- <u>Contents</u>: Map to view the Table of Contents.

- <u>Page Notes</u>: **2** Tap to view your page notes.



Annotations – Highlights





- <u>Highlight</u>: To highlight text in the content, press the text to be highlighted and to bring up the menu, then select **Highlight**.
- <u>Adding/Editing a Highlight Comment</u>: To add/edit a comment to highlighted text, tap the highlighted text to bring up the menu, then select **Note**.
- <u>Removing a Highlight</u>: To remove a highlight, tap the highlighted text to bring up the menu, then select **Remove Highlight**.



• <u>Remove a dBook</u>: Press the dbook icon to bring up the X icon at the top left corner of the dbook icon, then tap the X.


Settings Menu functions:



- <u>Manage Devices</u>: Tap to display your list of registered devices. Your device is registered when you log in and start Cisco eReader for iPad, Windows or Android the first time on that device. Tap a device name to deregister that device.
- <u>Deregister</u>: Tap to deregister your iPad device.
- Important Deregistering a device will delete all dbooks that you downloaded to that device, and any unsynced annotations will be lost.

iPad eReader – App Settings

- Tap the **Settings** app on your iPad.
- Tap **Cisco eReader** in the left pane.
- The right pane will display the build details and allow you to set a setting.



 <u>Enable Page Preview</u>: Toggle enable/disable page preview. Page preview allows you to see part of the next page when swiping up on a page.





 <u>Search</u>: Use the Search box to search for text in the course material, highlighted passages, highlight comments and page notes. You can click All or Content or Highlight or Note or Page Note, respectively, to specify which search results to view.



Windows eReader – Annotations

Functions and Options:



- <u>Contents</u>: Click to view the Table of Contents. The Table of Contents can be used to navigate through the dbook.
- <u>Bookmarks</u>: Click to view previously saved bookmarks.
 Bookmark notes can only be added/edited in the Online eReader at this time.
- Highlights: O Click to view, add or edit comments to highlighted material. User comments can be copied from the edit box. The Highlights list can be used to navigate through the dbook.

Windows eReader – Annotations

Highlights



- <u>Highlight</u>: To highlight text in the Content Pane, select the text to be highlighted, right-click to bring up the right-click menu, then select **Highlight**.
- <u>Adding/Editing a Highlight Comment</u>: To add/edit a comment to highlighted text in the Content Pane, right-click on the highlighted text, then select **Note**.
- <u>Removing a Highlight</u>: To remove a highlight, right-click on the highlighted text in the Content Pane, then select **Remove Highlight**.

Windows eReader – Annotations

 <u>Page Notes</u>: Use this pane to add, edit and view notes on a given page. The list of Page Notes can be used to navigate through the dbook.

Search

• <u>Bookmark</u>: This toggle button is located at the top right of every page. Click to add/remove a bookmark on that page. A list of bookmarks will appear in the Bookmarks tab in the Annotations Pane.

- <u>Icon/List View</u>: I Click to toggle between Icon View and List View.
- <u>Remove a dBook</u>: Right-click on a downloaded dbook to bring up the right-click menu. Select **Remove book**. The dbook will be removed only from the device you are using. The dbook will still be available online and on the other devices where you downloaded it.
- <u>Sync</u>: O Click to synchronize your annotations with the server. Otherwise your annotations are only saved on your local device.

- <u>Manage Devices</u>: Click to display your list of registered devices. Your device is registered when you log in and start Cisco eReader for Windows, iPad or Android the first time on that device.
- Click **Deregister** to deregister a device.
- Important Deregistering a device will delete all dbooks that you downloaded to that device, and any unsynced annotations will be lost.

 Exit without logging out: Click the X icon at the top right of the window to exit without logging out. The next time you start Cisco eReader, you do **not** need to log back in to read your dbooks.
